Self-Check for Approaches to Learning

Approaches to Learning is a unique and critical domain of children's development. The components - curiosity and eagerness, persistence, creativity, planning and reflections - address how children deal with new environments, interactions and discoveries and describes children's attitudes and dispositions towards learning. The following elements will help teachers in thinking about how to plan and arrange the environment to support children's approaches to learning.
